Format

First, as in past years, we continue to adhere closely to the successful format of fixed, 10-minute lecture blocks, followed by a question-and-answer period of similar length.

To enhance these lectures, we always ask our presenters to focus on family practice or primary care problems, using cases or problems that audience members will find relevant to their practices. Also building on what registrants have indicated as a successful addition to the course, our syllabus is an extensive reminder and reinforcer of learning. Registrants are provided with a set of dividers, which will assist in the storage and retrieval of past speakers' notes.

A successful innovation begun ten years ago, registrants may choose to take a multiple-choice examination based on the educational and clinical content of the previous month.

Focus Groups

Focus groups help plan activities for the year, assist in program evaluation, and make suggestions for the continuing improvement of the course. 


