Participants for this program will be from the academic centres including physicians leaders and administrative directors.
- The Office of CEPD will be responsible for the planning, implementation and evaluation of Congress 2012, the North American conference for continuing health education held every four years. This conference will be held at the Allstream Centre, May 30-June 2, 2012.

## 2007-08 Strategic Objective

## With the development of a new business plan and a thorough review of the past year's and forecasted budgets, the Office of CEPD will explore collaborative, viable and innovative programs to support the academic strategic initiatives.

## Saturday at the University

This program will require extensive promotion and protection, as the only program offered directly by the Office. There is an opportunity to rejuvenate the program to appeal to a wider audience and begin to target those physicians practicing in Ontario who will require proof of participation in continuing education.

## Mini-Med School

In conjunction with the School of Continuing Studies (SCS), the Office of CEPD will develop a collaborative business model that will expand on the successful implementation of the Mini-Med School (MMS). With the marketing opportunities of the SCS, the MMS is poised to become the premier public outreach program for the University of Toronto. Additional faculty partners will be developed for future MMS.

## International Programs

A new opportunity to develop international CE programs has been proposed.

## Accreditation and Sponsorship

A value-added component will be featured with the accreditation and sponsorship process with the addition of an Education Consultant (.5FTE). The consultant will be available to managed and sponsored courses, free of charge, to provide advice and guidance regarding the educational development and quality of an event. Specifically highlighting issues regarding needs assessment, learning objectives and outcome evaluation.

## 2008-09 Implementation

- Have actively pursued unique business contracts and policies to sustain operations and scholarship of the Office of CEPD including the partnership with the Peter A. Silverman Centre for International Health, the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario, and with aggressive branding and marketing of conference and course management services of the Office of CEPD.
- Two part time educationalists have been hired to provide educational support for event planners, CE directors, course directors and department chairs.
- Conference management services reorganized and realigned after extensive environmental survey of our customers.
- New branding and marketing strategies developed and implemented.
- Further development of online course and conference accreditation systems.
- Website redesigned in the past year.
- Professional development (PD) of both staff and faculty has been a priority.
- Staff have several PD sessions/year and are encouraged to seek external PD opportunities.
- Several PD courses created for faculty to build expertise in CE planning, development, evaluation and scholarship i.e. the CE 101 course, the Foundations Course and the Continuing Education Leadership Program (CELP).

## 2009-10 Implementation

- Innovative programming originating from the Office of CEPD has created new opportunities and proven to be cost neutral or revenue generating.
- Opportunities to expand and market Information Services has greatly increased. Best practices in web based event management systems have been shared with other university departments across Canada.
- Full description of new Information Services found on page 37.
- Extensive foray into social media has allowed the Office of CEPD to expand the distribution of information regarding programs and services.
   Full description of Strategic Communications found in this report on page 37.
- Continued support for the professional development of event management staff. Certified Meeting Planner (CMP) designations achieved by some members of staff and attendance at international conferences regarding meeting planning. Innovative and fresh approaches to providing event management support have been brought forward and shared with many clinical Course Directors.
- Further streamlining and enhancement of web based management systems have enabled the Event Management component of the Office of CEPD to become cost neutral.

Although not an additional income generating proposal, the Education Consultant will provide a much needed service and the perception of value-added for the U of T sponsorship fee. It is anticipated that the accreditation and sponsorship process will expand and provide additional revenue to the R&D budget.

## **Event Management**

- A new branding process has already begun within the Office with a new logo, website and marketing brochure. Potential expanded duties and responsibilities of internal staff will begin to promote the resources and services of the Office.
- Enhancement of fee packaging for resources and services provided by the Office.
- Further expansion of web based Event Management System (EvMS) to include details of advertising contacts and processes, budget and cost statement views, and refinement of the sponsorship review process.
- A review of supplier contracts will be implemented. The opportunity to outsource some administrative functions of the Office may be considered more cost effective. Specifically,

Venue contracts: Negotiation for meeting, accommodation and catering will be proposed as block process, meeting with National Account Managers rather than contracting with individual sites. Cost saving from block reservations will be shared with each event. Any point sharing program will be returned to the Office and shared amongst the various programs.

**Airline arrangements:** determine if an affiliated contract is possible.

**Mailing house:** In some cases, the use of an external mailing house for packaging and distributing materials will be more cost effective.

## DEPARTMENT: FAMILY AND COMMUNITY MEDICINE DIRECTOR: JAMES MEUSER

The Professional Development (PD) Program in the University of Toronto Department of Family and Community Medicine (DFCM) has had a critical role in implementing DFCM's strategic plan, in particular the plan's commitment to: "Attract, retain, and nurture faculty for leadership and sustained excellence". Areas of focus for the PD program have been:

- Supporting an Academic Leadership Task Force and implementation of its activities,
- Supporting Chiefs and faculty through the Junior Promotions process,
- Building the Clinical Teacher Certificate as a robust and logical next step for faculty interested in pursuing additional faulty development activities,
- · Increasing scholarship and dissemination within the PD portfolio,
- Optimizing the Academic Fellowship and Masters' programs with regard to their place in the menu of professional development offerings available to different audiences,
- Developing and implementing faculty development programming around the competency-based residency curriculum (with Residency Program Committee),
- Continuing integration activities for 3 expansion sites in the past 2 years, Royal Victoria Hospital in Barrie, Southlake in Newmarket, and Markham-Stouffville hospital,
- · Clarifying and streamlining appointment and promotion for non-MD faculty,
- Developing a plan for moving KT forward within the DFCM

## Some specific activities:

## **Basics Program**

We completed the 2009 round of Basics in November (for the largest cohort ever – over 70 participants), and launched the latest round in June. This program continues to be a significant element of DFCM's successful expansion of its residency program. Feedback from participants has been generally very positive. Specifically, it would appear from both the informal and formal evaluations we've done that we succeeded in our goal of providing new teachers, particularly those from the 4 expansion sites, with sufficient basic knowledge and skills to make them competent and confident in their roles, and have laid a solid basis for excellence. A workshop on interprofessional teaching has been added to this year's program on a trial basis.

## **Faculty Development for non-MD Faculty**

One other task that we have committed to is to look at the Basics Program specifically to assess its suitability for new teachers who are not family physicians. We had observers from the DFCM IPE Working Group sitting in on the program, and have undertaken a detailed de-brief of non-MD participants regarding specific aspects of content and process. A group from the PD Committee, in collaboration with members of the DFCM IPE Working Group are currently collaborating on a research project to assess and improve preparation and support of non-physicians teaching Family Medicine residents. An important early element of the project is an inventory of teaching being done by non-MD colleagues across all our teaching units. We are currently awaiting ethics approval to launch a survey of these individuals to delineate their responsibilities, degree of preparation, and degree of satisfaction within their educational roles. Resources permitting, we intend to include a substantial sample of this group in focus groups that will explore preparation and supports needed to excel as teachers.

## "Scholarships" for Clinical Teachers Certificate

The PD Committee has been looking for ways to assist faculty members who want to pursue enrichment activities around teaching and learning, who have completed Basics and other DFCM or Faulty events but aren't' ready to commit to a Master's program. Recognizing that the Clinical Teacher's Certificate (CTC) already offers a flexible opportunity to expand understanding of clinical education and to effectively and efficiently improve teaching, the Committee has decided to fund the CTC tuition costs of up to 4 DFCM faulty members annually.

## **DFCM Master's Degree Programs**

The MPH and MScCH Programs elicited an unprecedented degree of interest for this academic year with:

- 15 Applicants for the MPH (FCM)
- 7 Applicants for the MScCH (FCM)
- 36 Applicants for the MScCH (HPTE)

Dr. Lynn Wilson, Chair of DFCM, has convened a planning group to look at the potential for further development of the Family Medicine stream of the MPH. Among the ideas being explored are:

- the possibility of incorporating areas of concentration within the program, such as research in primary care and global health.
- making some or all of the program accessible through distance learning technologies.

## **Mentorship Needs Survey**

DFCM faculty have been surveyed to assess their involvement in, and additional needs for, mentorship activities. We hope to use the information to assess the impact of our current mentorship initiatives, and to change or develop programs in response.

## Information for Faculty Members Considering Promotion

Hands-on workshops for faculty considering promotion to Associate or Full Professor have resulted in a doubling of the number of candidates going forward from the DFCM since the workshops started 2 years ago and an overall increase in the quality of promotion dossiers, according to reviewers.

A similar educational initiative will be launched this academic year aimed at the very large group of faculty who could be promoted from Lecturer to Assistant Professor.

## "Beyond the Basics"

The PD Committee's annual educational enrichment event in February 2010 focused on "Practical Skills for Faculty". A panel drawn from across all levels of experience and seniority in the department examined questions of competency and mastery in academic life, and a smorgasbord of skills-themed workshops highlighted topics such as academic writing, using technology in teaching, and applying quality improvement techniques in teaching and practice. It is anticipated that the 2011 event will have academic career development as its theme.

## **Primary Care Today 2010**

Registration for the May, 2010 PCT conference reached over 2200 participants. Attendees were exposed to 27 hours of large group teaching and 18 Mainpro-C workshops. Evaluations of the educational program were virtually universally extremely positive.

## Helen P. Batty Awards

Both the PD Committee and Director received these Faulty of Medicine awards for Innovation in Faculty Development Program Development. The PD committee has decided to use these funds to assist a Family Medicine training program or program-in-development in a resource poor setting to send a faculty member to a relevant faculty development event.

## **Comprehensive Family Practice Review**

This educational pilot, a collaboration between DFCM and the Faculty CEPD Office, has been commissioned and supported by the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario. The intent is to equip participants with knowledge and skills as excellent primary care practitioners, learners, and collaborators. The program consists of a 5-weekend group learning component whose content is organized within the CanMEDS-FM competency framework, and a 1-to-1 preceptorship component. DFCM faculty have taken on roles within both the didactic and preceptorship elements of the program

The Continuing Mental Health Education Committee (CMHE) continues to thrive in coordinating and targeting continuing education activities for health professionals, with a primary emphasis on educating psychiatrists, family physicians, pediatricians, and community-based therapists. Continuing Education (CE) activities remain largely decentralized, with hospitals, programs, and divisions providing their own administrative support. The CMHE Committee comprises of representatives from hospitals, programs, and divisions within the Department, all of whom foster CE activities and directly lead and teach in a majority of the Department's programs. Thanks to the presence of a formal CME office as well as well-equipped meeting room space, the Centre for Addiction and Mental Health (CAMH) provides approximately one-half of the Department of Psychiatry CE programs. The range, scope, and number of programs (see table) makes the Toronto Department of Psychiatry the world's largest academic provider of Continuing Mental Health Education.

## **Scope of Programs**

While 65 Department of Psychiatry programs are shown as accredited through the University of Toronto in the table, there are numerous additional accredited events such as Grand Rounds. The major 65 programs span the range of formats, including 14 large conferences aimed predominantly at a wide audience, 29 longitudinal courses designed to develop skills in participants from the local area, and 22 intensive, 2-3 day training institutes designed to impart very specific skills, usually in psychotherapy. A special feature of Departmental CE include a number of "Certificate" programs, where a participant who completes a number of training events and writes two exams receives an official University of Toronto certificate in that area. The Department of Psychiatry hopes to maintain its leadership in CE by actively cultivating new course directors, offering numerous faculty development events devoted to educational scholarship, and encouraging the dedication of the faculty both to evidence-based treatments and to the use of educational scholarship in order to provide innovative, exciting, and diverse programs. ## Education Research, Knowledge Translation, and Scholarly Presentations

Multiple individuals in the department conduct projects in educational research and Knowledge Translation, with several holding CIHR grants in this area. Development of tools in Mood disorders, in Mental health issues for Women, and in Adolescent Mental health are significant foci. Key national guidelines in Depression and in Bipolar Disorder are co-authored by multiple department members, who are then also involved in dissemination activities of these guidelines. Several articles were published in the past year describing these activites, and multiple presentations have been made at national and international meeting to identify innovations in Continuing Education program design and outcomes.

The Ivan Silver Award is the premiere recognition in the Department of Psychiatry for scholarship in Continuing Education, based on innovation in design, educational formats, excellence in teaching delivery, and measurement of outcome. This year's winner was Dr. Jennifer Jones for *Maximizing your Patient Education Skills (MPES): Evaluating an innovative inter-professional patient education skills training course for oncology health care professionals*. This project was a collaborative project between researchers and educators at University of Toronto, University Health Network (UHN) and Cancer Care Ontario (CCO);

## Office of CEPD Initiatives

The Office Of CEPD has had a proactive year in developing many new ideas and concepts and implementing into practice. The following describes these key initiatives:

## INNOVATIVE PROGRAMMING

The Office of CEPD has taken the lead in offering programs that professionalize the field of continuing health education (CHE). Two specific leadership programs have been planned, implemented and evaluated for continuing health education providers.

The initial program, **Foundations in Continuing Health Education**, focuses on collaborating with key stakeholders by providing fundamental theory and skill acquisition in the areas of educational development, implementation and administration. It was designed to address practical issues commonly experienced in the design, development and implementation of CHE. The program was of particular relevance to CHE administrators, educators and program planners. Its goals were to make a significant impact on the quality of CHE, resulting in better healthcare outcomes, by providing a high level training program guaranteeing consistency and a common language for all professionals engaged in the field. Its objectives were to have participants be able to: explain experiential learning and its influence on program design, list characteristics of the professional learner that impacts educational design, identify different levels of learning needs, list a series of methodologies for assessing learning needs, choose methods most appropriate for different educational interventions, define learning domains, write and critique effective learning goals and objectives, describe learning methods that are effective for a variety of educational interventions, define different levels of evaluation, navigate the way through systems of accreditation and determine the appropriate measures to achieve a bias free/balanced CHE program.

This modular formatted program has been delivered as a pre-conference at the annual Canadian Association for Continuing Health Education (CACHE) annual conference, the 2010 Association of Medical Education in Europe (AMEE) annual conference, and as individualized workshops for various constituencies.

The **Continuing Education Leadership Program (CELP)** program focuses on today's health care system becoming increasingly complex – from overload of guidelines and new information, to the increasing cost of services, to an ever-changing technological frontier. CHE providers play an important role in supporting health professional to keep up with the changing environment.

CELP is a certificate program designed to meet the needs of individuals who are interested in promoting excellence, innovation, change, and scholarship in continuing education initiatives for health professionals. It specifically aims to provide participants with a broad range of valuable management and leadership skills and the tools necessary to lead continuing education initiatives for health professionals in today's complex health care environment. The program objectives are: identify and discuss how the demands and forces of change in the health care environment have created opportunities and challenges to CHE providers; use a systems thinking approach to map the clinical care gaps and change needs and strategically align CHE to meet these gaps and needs; apply innovation principles and change process to lead, implement new initiatives and overcome barriers to change; foster collaboration with a diversity of stakeholders in CHE to enable success; and lead and promote innovation in CHE locally, nationally and internationally.

The two-week residential program was offered in March 2010 and October 2010. Sixteen participants from academia, industry, associations and regulatory authorities were brought together and mentored to develop their own CHE initiatives.

Working collaboratively with the Department of Family and Community Medicine and the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario is the Comprehensive Family Practice Review. Scheduled to begin in Fall 2010, this program will allow licensed physicians to re-enter or change their scope of practice. Led by Drs. Jamie Meuser and Patrick Skalenda, this five weekend modular program will provide participants with extensive theory and the opportunity to be partnered with a community-based preceptor. A full description and evaluation review of this program will appear in the 2010-11 annual report.

#### STRATEGIC COMMUNICATIONS

The Office of CEPD has undergone extensive renovations in the past year as it relates to our communication strategies. Amanda Jerome, our new Communications Liaison, has been developing and implementing two new components of our communication strategy: an online newsletter and social media.

The first Better Education for Better Outcomes™ "Bebo" newsletter was distributed electronically in the fall of 2009. It is a seasonal newsletter that includes a message from the Vice Dean, Education Consultant tips, events list, profiles on researchers and event planners and news briefs. The newsletter is distributed via email to its 400 subscribers and is posted on the homepage of the CEPD website. By using an e-newsletter, we are supporting our goal of reducing paper, without diminishing the amount or accessibility to information. Keeping participants informed is of paramount importance.

The Office of CEPD is utilizing mainstream communications, Facebook and Twitter, to open more ways for participants to find information and contact our office. Course information is posted on Facebook and Twitter so that followers will be updated in real time when developments happen. In this way we are connecting to our participants through social networks that they already utilize in their day to day lives. This makes it easier for them to stay connected to the Office of CEPD and it makes it easier for us to keep them informed. #### **INFORMATION SERVICES**

Information technology developments have continued at a dramatic pace within the Office of CEPD. Our integrated events management and registration system (EvMS) was enhanced significantly and we have transformed it into a cloud application, which we are marketing to other Canadian CE departments. It is now in use by three Faculties of Medicine in Canada, including ourselves, who work collaboratively on determining the feature set and general direction of future growth, based on our shared experience in this unique business/medical/educational niche. Our work with these other universities has already paid dividends, as we now have many more users who can, and do, provide new insights and fresh approaches for the benefit of all participants.

A new growth potential for this next year will be the launch of a new application and processes geared towards providing credit card processing services. Initially, this concept was developed to meet our own requirements for providing online registrants with a straightforward way to pay online. Finding commercial solutions overly intrusive, we will design a stand alone credit card processing application service that works alongside with, but independently from, our online registration system. This credit card system will be launched in November 2010 and will be used by two Faculties of Medicine in Canada. We hope to be able to further enhance this product and market it to other university departments who wish to integrate credit card processing into their systems.

Due to our new initiatives in social media we have adopted a policy that we will connect with current and future learners in the ways that they expect and are accustomed to. A great deal of our printed and electronic matter now contains links to these online communities (Twitter and Facebook) and we expect the importance of them to our business to increase dramatically in the coming years. For 2010-11, we have many new initiatives planned, including online services to support individualized learning, providing event search and registration capabilities for Android and iPhone devices, and releasing a new version of our online application for sponsorship, which has allowed us to dramatically increase the number of events we can accredit while simultaneously maximizing the educational quality of each of those events.

#### **GREENER LEARNING**

The Office of CEPD has implemented a green transformation over the past year. A push to reduce paper was completed by introducing an online system for electronic submission of accreditation and sponsorship applications, as well as post event materials. All approval documentation is distributed by email, which also helps reduce the amount of paper, as well as minimizes the carbon footprint by eliminating the need for couriers and postal services. Over the last 5 years, sponsorship of online or web-based courses has quadrupled. Our Registration Coordinators encourage course participants to utilize the paperless registration processes online and email communications. Online registration, payments and email distribution of receipts, as well as electronic accreditation letters are eliminating the dependence on paper.

Onsite event management changes such as eliminating bottled water and using compostable products have helped to reduce the impact of our meetings on the environment. When advertising and marketing our events, electronic practices and distribution are strongly encouraged, including social networking on Facebook and Twitter. Also, FSC-Certified printers are utilized for all printed material. Content management has also undergone a push to reduce paper. Many of our events post program content on a secure website, while others offer a reusable flash drive in place of a printed syllabus. This trend of green transformation is supported in practice by the rest of the University of Toronto, which is progressing towards being an environmentally responsible institution in all aspects.

# **International Continuing Health Education Collaborative (ICHEC)**

In aligning with the social responsibility mandate of the University of Toronto, the International Continuing Health Education Collaborative (ICHEC) was established in 2009, to provide international access to University of Toronto's continuing health education and professional development programs and expertise in order to enhance the ability of health professionals globally. ICHEC was established as a partnership between the University Of Toronto Faculty Of Medicine, Office of Continuing Education and Professional Development (CEPD), and the Peter A. Silverman Centre for International Health (PASCIH) at Mount Sinai Hospital.

ICHEC's model is a collaborative one, bringing together the best and brightest medical minds from the Toronto healthcare community to work with local collaborators from both the public and private sectors to develop programs which target the specific needs and reflect local health issues, while adapting education techniques to the learning environment.

ICHEC believes, sharing innovative education techniques, and drawing upon research to accelerate knowledge transfer, enables a more effective learning experience. This then empowers healthcare professionals globally to make better decisions around the care and treatment of their patients – therefore driving improved health outcomes locally.

Following the formal launch of ICHEC in August 2009, Abi Sriharan was appointed as a part time Director for ICHEC. The first of year ICHEC turned out to be a fruitful year with the launch of number of new partnerships and projects. Below is a summary of key ICHEC activities of 2009-2010.

## Saudi Arabia- UofT/Saudi Primary Care Update

Five University of Toronto faculty members from the departments of medicine, psychiatry, family and community medicine and pediatrics visited Saudi Arabia for a three day conference on primary care. Dr. John Axler from the Department of Family and Community Medicine was the Course Director for this program.

## Hamad Medical Corporation/UofT Audiology Technician Training Program

The Hamad Medical Corporation and the Peter A. Silverman Centre for International Health has a long standing partnership in developing national programme on newborn hearing screening in Qatar. As part of this programme, Hamad Medical Corporation identified the need to develop a continuing education for their physicians and hearing screeners to prepare them with required skills and knowledge to manage the universal newborn hearing screening program. As a result a unique nine month training programme was established in partnership with the Hamad Medical Corporation to prepare an interprofessional team of health professionals engaged in hearing screening in Qatar. Dr Arnold Noyek from the Department of Otolaryngology was the Course Director for this program.

# Joint Program in Knowledge Translation

Knowledge translation is defined as a dynamic and iterative process that includes synthesis, dissemination, exchange and ethically-sound application of knowledge to improve the health of Canadians, provide more effective health services and products and strengthen the health care system.

The Joint Program in Knowledge Translation is a collaboration between the Li Ka Shing Knowledge Institute at St. Michael's Hospital and the Office of Continuing Education and Professional Development, Faculty of Medicine, University of Toronto.

The Joint Program in Knowledge Translation designs and evaluates interventions to increase the likelihood of incorporating the best available evidence into practice and policy, and researches the best strategy to implement knowledge in a variety of areas, including: critical care and trauma, diabetes, patient education, continuing medical education, interprofessional care, and the management of chronic diseases in the developing world.

In March 2010, the Office of CEPD was very pleased to welcome Dr Simon Kitto from the Department of Surgery, Monash University, Australia. Simon is a medical sociologist specializing in qualitative and mixed methods research methodologies. With his arrival, Simon became the Director of Research for the Office of CEPD, an Assistant Professor in the Department of Surgery, a Scientist at the Li Ka Shing Knowledge Institute of St Michael's Hospital, and at the Wilson Centre for Research in Education.

In his previous position, Simon (co)-lead education research projects at undergraduate, postgraduate and continuing education levels. His research was informed by a knowledge translation and interprofessionalism focus operationalised through by a medical sociology theoretical lens. Some specific projects that he was actively involved in the Australian context include: EBM adoption issues in general surgery; experiences of learning to be a doctor at the intern level; challenges to effective interprofessional OR communication; the development of non-technical competencies in the areas of Natural Disaster Response for surgeons and in multi-source feedback systems for anesthesia, both of which were geared towards interprofessional relevance and competence.

Simon was recently appointed as an Associate Editor for the Journal of Interprofessional Care and is the lead editor of a new book entitled: Sociology of Interprofessional Healthcare practice: Critical Reflections and Concrete Solutions, due for publication in 2010 by Nova Science Publishers. He is interested in conducting research on, and building research capacity within, the intersections between Continuing Education, Knowledge Translation, Quality Improvement and Patient Safety. RICE meetings occur every 6 weeks at the University of Toronto Office CEPD and attract both core members and other interested academics. The goal of these meetings is to build a community of continuing education research practice, explore educational and other scientific theories that might be applied to the domain of CE, and to provide a forum in which CE researchers can present work-in-progress as well as completed studies. Three core members of RICE are responsible for adjudicating the CEPD Research and Development grants which are submitted 3 times per year. They have also contributed to reviewing and modifying the Research and Development grant criteria and proposing changes in the grant submission process. The scholarly return on investment of these small seed grants has been significant.

Accomplishments by the members of the RICE Committee include: obtaining peer review grants; presenting at regional, national and international meetings; publishing manuscripts in peer review journals; and innovating in the realm of CE practice. Under the leadership of Dr. Simon Kitto, who was appointed for Research Director in the Office of CEPD in March 2010, a grant proposal has been submitted to the Association of Faculties of Medical Colleges (AFMC) to explore future partnership of CE researchers with those in Quality and Patient Safety and Knowledge Translation. Several RICE members are also co-investigators in a CIHR Team Grant proposal led by Dr. Joan Sargeant and Dr. France Legare.

A survey of the RICE members in the summer of 2010 indicated that the members are very satisfied with the format of our meetings and that they have benefited from the development of a community of CEPD practice. They voted unanimously to continue our association.








